1. The main divisions within the Old Testament

"Bible" = "biblia" = "books"

- 39 OT, 27 NT... many types of writing...
- from: Moses about C15th BC → Apostles C1st AD = 1600yrs.
- But ONE message... because ONE author (2 Timothy 3:16)

The Old Testament

- Hebrew OT = 1500-400BC = Moses to Malachi
- Greek OT translation = about 200BC = "Septuagint" or LXX

Our English Bibles follow the Greek LXX ordering of the OT

- **The Law** = "torah" = "instruction"
- **Former prophets:** not history... but *preaching* the history of God's people
- Latter prophets: warning and promise... about God's judgment
- The Writings = a.k.a. "The Psalms" sometimes grouped in with "The Law and the Prophets"
 - (i) "Wisdom" = Job, Proverbs, Song of Songs, some Psalms
 - (ii) The rest = about the Babylonian exile and beyond

2. The main message of the Old Testament

(a) The Law and the Prophets LOOKED FORWARD...

Matthew 11:13, "For all the Prophets and the Law prophesied until John..."

(b) The Old Testament is about JESUS

Luke 24:26-27

(c) The Old Testament is about God's "KINGDOM"

Mark 1:14-15 Jesus says: "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel."

(d) All the Bible's "big ideas" come together in "COVENANT"¹

Matthew 26:28, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins"

Luke 1:72-73, "to show the mercy promised to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant, the oath that he swore to our father Abraham..."

What is a covenant?

- A relationship between two parties
- o Between God and human beings
- Conditions: God promises blessings... AND curses
- A bond established by blood
