# 4. The Fall: rebellion and curse

Genesis 3:1 – 4:1

# Discuss while waiting to begin...

- Why do you sin?!
- What do you say / do / think when you sin?! <sup>Be honest!</sup>

# 1. An act of rebellion

- The snake = Satan (Revelation 12:9, 20:2)
- Adam and Eve's rebellion: doubting God's Word and God's goodness

# 2. God's response: the curses of the covenant

- Marriages and childbearing (3:16, cf. 4:7)
- Creation and work (3:17-19, Romans 8)
- Death and the presence of God (3:19, 22-24, Revelation 21:8)

# 3. The Gospel is promised

- Bruising the serpent's head Genesis 3:15
- Clothed through death Genesis 3:21
- Adam: faith and obedience? Genesis 3:20, 4:1

# 4. The significance of the Fall: we all sinned and fell with Adam (1 Cor. 15:20-22, Rom. 5:12-19)

- "Original Sin"
- Adam = the covenant head of the human race

Romans 5:18-19, Therefore, as one trespass led to <u>condemnation</u> for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. <sup>19</sup> For as by the one man's disobedience the many were <u>made sinners</u>, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous.

- We inherit guilt ("condemnation")
- We inherit a sinful nature ("made sinners")

NOT: we sin  $\rightarrow$  we have sinful nature BUT: we have a sinful nature  $\rightarrow$  so we sin

Psalm 51:5, "Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me.
