 5000 complete NTs from before 350AD
 Caesar's history 10 copies, 1000 yrs later
 Pliny's history 7 copies, 750 yrs later
 - What John wrote is what took place

 - Suffering is a result of a broken relationship
 - Jesus suffered to restore that relationship
