6. PREDESTINATIONROMANS 9:6-24, 11:33-36

1. Introducing Predestination

- (a) Basics
 - Keywords: "predestination" and "election" = choosing
 - Definition: "Before the foundation of the world God chose to save a fixed number of individuals. He chose them purely for his own glory, because of his loving mercy, and not because of their foreknown faith, good works, or perseverance."
- (b) Predestination and the sovereignty of God (e.g. Eph 1:11)
- (c) Asking questions about predestination intellectual and personal
- (d) Predestination in church history: Calvinism vs. Arminianism

2. Predestination explained

"This divine choice is an expression of free and sovereign grace, for it is unconstrained and unconditional, not merited by anything in those who are its subjects. God owes sinners no mercy of any kind, only condemnation; so it is a wonder, and matter for endless praise, that he should choose to save any of us; and doubly so when his choice involved the giving of his own Son to suffer as sin-bearer for the elect (Romans 8:32)." (J.I. Packer, Concise Theology, p149).

- (a) Before the foundation of the world God chose
 - Ephesians 1:3-5
 - John 6:37-39
 - Total inability requires that GOD must chose if any are to be saved

(b) God chose a fixed number of individuals

- No person is responsible for his/her own salvation
- Named individuals: e.g. Jacob, Esau, Pharoah, the 7,000 (Romans 9,11) and those listed in the lamb's book of life (Rev 13:8, 20:11-15, 21:27; also see 6:11).

(c) God chose some for salvation

- "Those to whom God applies the blessings of salvation IN TIME, are those whom he has chosen BEFORE time."
- E.g. Romans 9:23, Eph 1:5
- 2 Thessalonians 2:13, "But we ought always to thank God for you, brothers loved by the Lord, because from the beginning God chose you to be saved through the sanctifying work of the Spirit and through belief in the truth."
- Acts 13:48, "When the Gentiles heard this, they were glad and honored the word of the Lord; and all who were appointed for eternal life believed."

(d) God purposes not to save others ("reprobation")

- Romans 9:22, "prepared for destruction."
- 1 Peter 2:8, "A stone that causes men to stumble and a rock that makes them fall." They stumble because they disobey the message-- which is also what they were destined for."
- Proverbs 16:4, "The LORD works out everything for his own ends-- even the wicked for a day of disaster."
- Also John 6:64-65, 12:40, Romans 1:24, 11:7-8, Mark 4:12, Deut 2:30, Acts 2:23, 4:27-28, Luke 22:22.
- Not symmetrical (Isaiah 28:21, Exodus 34)

- (e) God chose for his own glory (e.g. Eph. 1:5-6)
- (f) God chose because of his loving mercy, not because of anything in us.

Calvinism = election → faith // Arminianism = foreseen faith → election

Election is unconditional:

Romans 9:15-16 Deut 7:7-8, 1 Cor 1:26-31

Eph 2:9, 2 Tim 1:9

Eph 1:4, election causes holiness, NOT vice versa
