1. WHAT IS THE BIBLE?

- "Bible" = "books"
- 39 OT, 27 NT
- Many different genres
- Dates: Moses in about 1500BC to Apostles in 1st century AD

2. WHAT IS THE BIBLE'S MESSAGE?

• = "the gracious and sovereign plan of God, to glorify Himself, by reversing the effects of sin and establishing the unchallenged rule of His Son."

 Mark 1:14-15, "After John was put in prison, Jesus went into Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God.¹⁵ "The time has come," he said.
"The kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe the good news!"

3. WHAT ARE THE MAIN DIVISIONS IN THE BIBLE?

- (a) Old Testament and New Testament
- (b) How does the Old Testament divide up?
 - The story of the OT
 - o OT written in Hebrew (and Aramaic) between 1500-400BC
 - o OT translated into Greek (Septuagint , LXX) in 200BC

• Our English Bibles follow the Greek LXX ordering of the OT:

Historical books	Mixed poetry	Prophetic books
Genesis to Esther	Job to Song of Songs	Isaiah to Malachi

• The <u>Hebrew</u> Bible has a different order: <u>law, prophets and writings</u> (e.g. Luke 24:44, Romans 3:21, Acts 28:23):

4. WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY ABOUT ITSELF? "WHAT THE BIBLE SAYS IS WHAT GOD SAYS"

- (a) The Bible is "inspired" by God
 - 2 Timothy 3:16, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness..."
 - "God-breathed" = theopneustos
 - o It DOES mean...
 - It DOESN'T mean...

(b) The Bible is God's Word through human authors

- 2 Peter 1:21, "For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit."
- Also Psalm 2 cited in Acts 4:25; and Psalm 110 cited in Acts 2:34, Hebrews 1:13 and Matthew 22:43

(c) Jesus believed that...

• The OT is God's Word

- Matthew 19:3-6 (who "said" Moses words in Genesis 2?)
- Matt 4:4 (law); Mark 12:10ff (poetry); Mark 7:6 (prophets)

- He submits and fulfils it as God's word: e.g. Mk 1:14-15, Mt 26:24,53f ,Mk 8:31, Lk 22:37, 24:25-27,44-46, Jn 5:39-40

- His own words were God's Words Mark 13:31, John 6:63, 15:3, 8:31, 14:24
- The NT writers wrote God's words John 14:26, 16:12-13 2 Peter 3:15-16

5. APPLICATION: HOW WE TREAT THE (WHOLE) BIBLE SHOWS WHAT WE THINK ABOUT GOD

- An example
- Sin (e.g. Genesis 3:1)
- Godliness (e.g. Psalm 1:1-2)
