4. THE FALL IS OUR STORY: WE ALL SINNED AND FELL WITH ADAM

- "Original Sin"
- Romans 5:19, "For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man the many will be made righteous."
- Adam = the covenant head of the human race God deals with all people "in Adam"

NOT: sin → sinful nature
BUT: sinful nature → sin
