What is independency?

Typically, independency is defined negatively:

- Protestant = not Roman Catholic
- Non-conformist = not 1559 Prayer Book
- Dissenting = not externally appointed leaders/rules
- Separatist = not under authority of 'civil magistrate'
- Wikipedia = not part of any denomination

Independency, however, is defined by what it is, not what it isn't.

We believe independency is a biblical model of church government.

Primarily this is about where ultimate authority resides: *inside* or *outside* of the local church, i.e. who makes decisions?

In Scripture we see:

- Jesus is the head of the church (Eph 1.22)
- Apostles are foundational gifts (Eph 2.20)
- Ascended Lord Jesus gives pastors to local church (Eph 4.11)

These local leaders include the entire vocabulary of local church leadership:

- Elders (Acts 20.17)
- Overseers/[Bishops] (Acts 20.28)
- Shepherds (Acts 20.28)

The pattern in Scripture is

- Plural leaders (Acts 20.17)
- Equal leaders (1 Tim 4.14)

How do leaders get appointed?

- Externally in start-ups (Titus 1.5)
- Internally thereafter (1 Tim 3, c.f. Acts 1/6)

If leaders are appointed *internally* it means that ultimate authority lies in the collective congregation. This truth reinforced in:

- Matthew 18.15-20
- **▶** 1 Cor 5.1-5
- Rev 2-3

Westminster Assembly (643-1653) spent several days on this one question. Presbyterians said authority ultimately resided in presbytery. Episcopalians said it resided in the bishop. Independents (e.g. John Owen) said it resided in the congregation.

Independency is a recognition that the church has a right, under Christ, to rule itself.

- Appoints its own leaders
- Guards its own membership
- Disciplines its own rebels
- Determines its own polity and rule

From the beginning, independents recognised the need for interdependency alongside independent government. This is the best way to understand Acts 18.27 or Acts 11.29.

Who are the FIEC?

Started 1922 to make gospel connections

- A fellowship
- Of independents
- That are evangelical

We have always been governed collectively by member churches. FIEC centrally has no authority. That resides in the local church.

Independent churches working together to reach Britain for Christ.

We define ourselves by a **statement of faith** and three ethos statements (women in ministry, ecumenicism and view on marriage). For more see www.fiec.org.uk/about-us/beliefs.

- Largest conservative evangelical grouping (56,000 members: ReNew churches 42,000 attenders, NFI 30,000 members)
- 601 churches in England, Scotland and Wales
- Approx 1 new church plant every three weeks
- Connected firm of solicitors Edward Connor
- Central team providing support to leaders
- Mix of churches


Current strategy:
