

Listen carefully to the Bible reading  
from Matthew 19v27 to 20v16

Look at Matthew 19v27  
Who is talking to Jesus? \_\_\_\_\_

What does he say he has

He wants to know if followers of Jesus will GET anything.  
Will they get any kind of reward?

Jesus gives a simple answer to this question, but also a very  
important lesson!

The simple answer is: Yes! There is an **amazing** reward  
for following Jesus!

Jesus says three things about this reward:

1. What will those who follow Jesus sit on? (look at verse  
28)

\_\_\_\_\_

This means followers of Jesus will share his royal work of ruling in his kingdom!

2. If we have to leave anything behind to follow Jesus - how much more will he give us? (look at verse 29)

---

This means 100 times more. That's a lot!

3. What else will we inherit if we follow Jesus? (to inherit is to get something when someone dies)

---

Wow! God gives so much to those who follow him!  
But - Jesus also has a very important lesson for us.

Put a ✓ or a ✗ in the □ for each of these sentences to show if they are right or wrong.


The first workers thought they deserved the most money □
