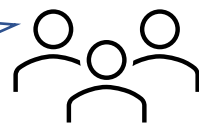
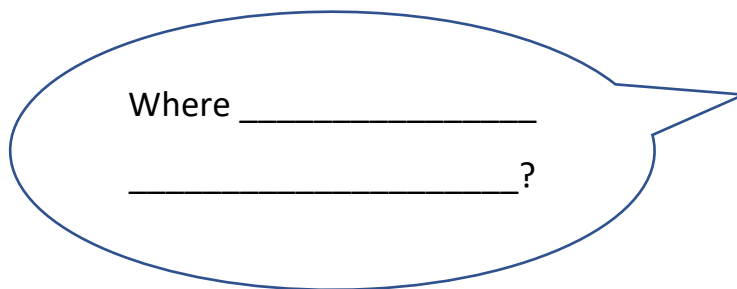
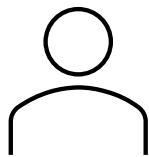

Wow! Can you believe it?

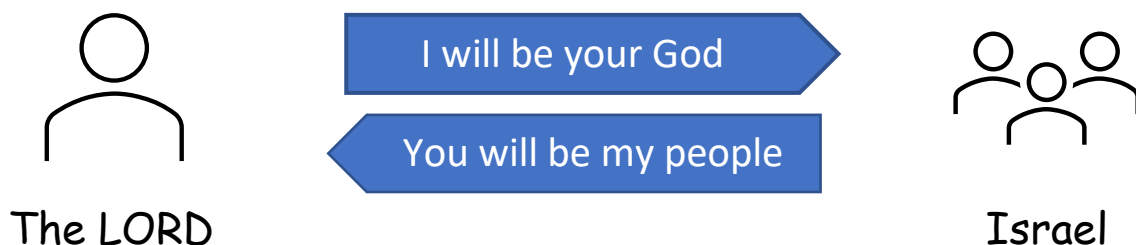

Do you know what a refiner does?

A refiner **separates** metal from rock



1. Metals like silver are hidden inside rock and must be separated by the refiner



2. The rock is placed in a container called a crucible and put into the hot furnace



3. Once it has been melted down it can be poured out



4. When melted the worthless rock becomes separated from the silver and can be scraped away



5. It may be placed back in the furnace several times till the silver becomes more and more pure



6. Finally the metal is left to cool as precious, pure silver!

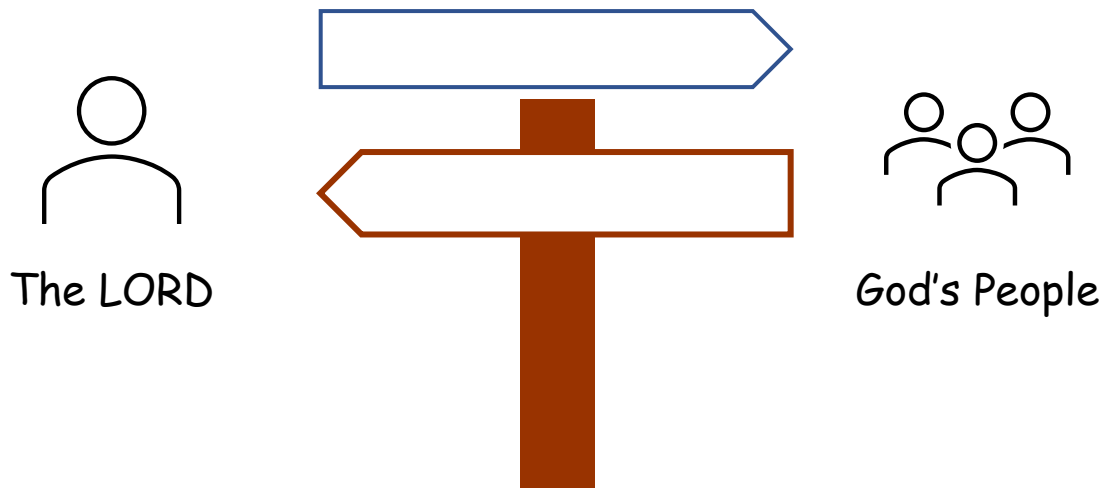
