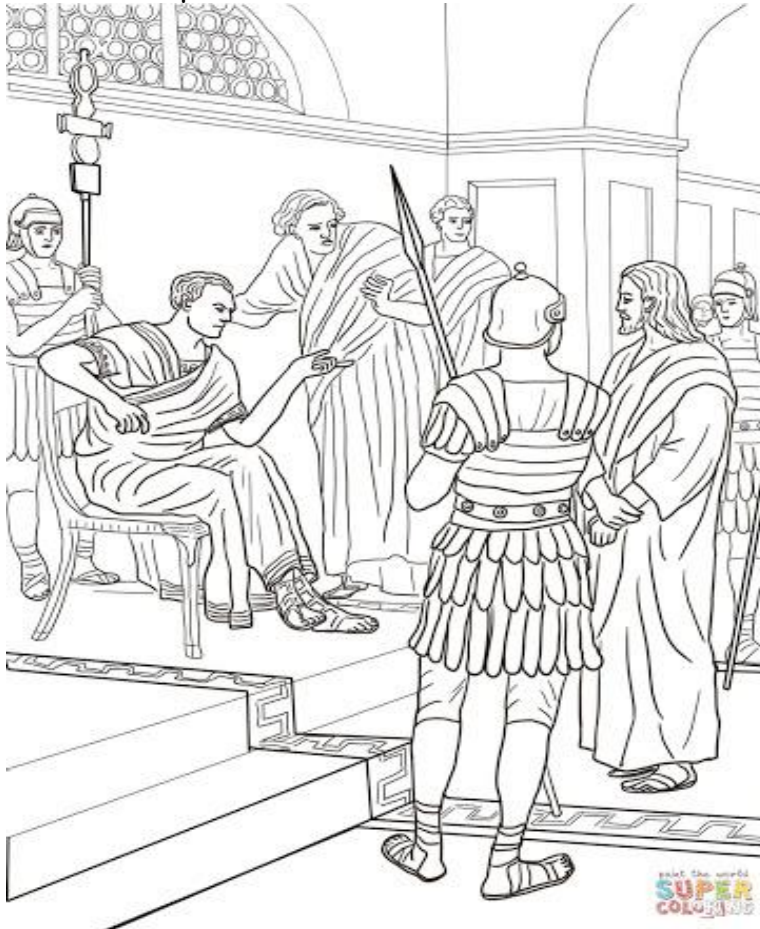

In today's passage we're going to see a lot about

innocence and

guilt.

Being innocent means that you've done nothing

wrong. Being guilty means you have.

First in our passage we see Jesus is the

innocent lamb. Jesus is led

away to die just like a lamb, like the Old Testament said he would be. But he has done

nothing wrong, he is
innocent.

Next we see Judas' guilt. He was wrong to

betray Jesus and he

realises that Jesus doesn't deserve to die.

But sadly he doesn't go to Jesus for

help instead he goes to the

religious leaders and they don't care.

Then we see the guilt of the envious religious

leaders. Being envious

means you want something that someone else

has and these leaders want to be

King instead of Jesus being

King.

Lastly, we see the guilt of the coward,

Pilate . He is afraid of what

the people think of him (that's what a coward
is) and so, although he knows that Jesus
doesn't deserve to die, he

sends him to die.

In our passage, Jesus is the only innocent one,

and that is still true
