

Listen carefully to the Bible reading from Genesis chapter 39 verses 1 to 23

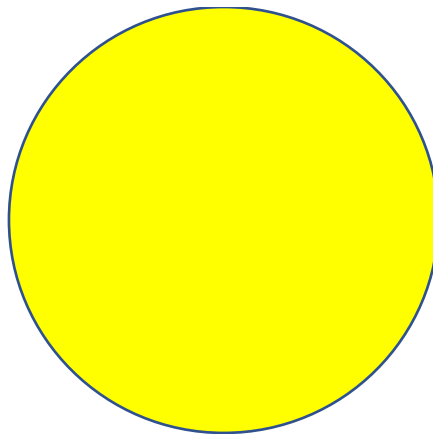
Read verse 1 again. Joseph had been sold as a slave!

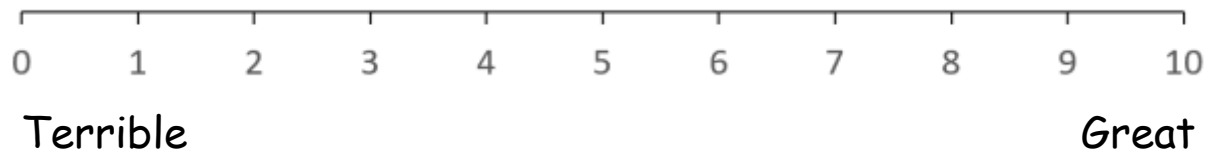

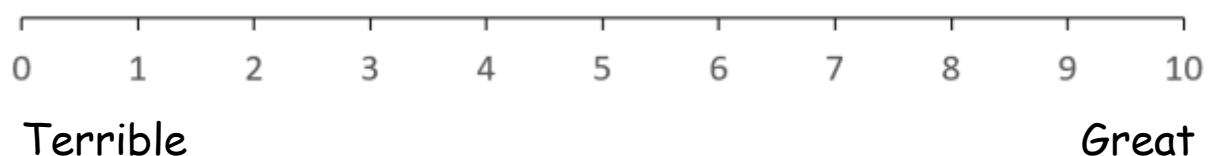


With God's help Joseph became an important man in Potiphar's house.
