1) HISTORY

Family worship was the 'norm' in the 16th and 17th century

2) WHY WORSHIP IN OUR FAMILIES?

The Westminster Confession of faith encourages FW in Chapter 21.6

*God is to be worshipped everywhere, **in spirit and truth**; as, **in private families**, daily, and in secret, each one by himself; so, more solemnly in the public assemblies...*

Three spheres of worship in the Christian life:

- Secret worship - Joshua 1:8, Psa 1:2, Matt 6
- Corporate worship - Ephesian 2:21
- Family worship - Deut 6:6-7, Psa 78:1-7, Psa 127:3,

Covenant parents have a responsibility to their covenant children

Joshua 24:1-15

Genesis 18:19

Psalm 78:1-7

Jonathan Edwards - "*Every Christian family ought to be as it were a little church.*"

Other good reasons to have family worship

1. Centres our homes
2. Encourages our children (and us) to walk with Christ
3. Encourages peace in the home
4. Binds family in the truth
5. Provides Bible knowledge
6. Prepares children for the Sunday gathering
7. Helps children see the role of spiritual leadership
8. Opportunity for discipleship

3) WHAT DOES FAMILY WORSHIP INVOLVE?

Spurgeon once said, "I agree with Matthew Henry when he says, 'They that pray in the family do well, they that pray and read the scriptures do better, but they that pray and read and sing do best of all. There is a completeness in that kind of family worship which is meant to be desired.'"

B - Prayer

C- Singing
