The Christian's holy war

Romans 8:12-13 2 Corinthians 10:3-6 Ephesians 6:10-20

The Christian's role in Christ's judgement

Romans 16:20 Matthew 19:28 Revelation 3:21

Q: Do modern-day events in the middle east have any connection to Joshua 6?

More questions...

Should we think of contemporary events in the Middle East as in any way fulfilling promises about the promised land that were made by God to Abraham and his descendants?

Does God regard with special favour an area of land in modern day Israel and one specific ethnic-religious group?

Is it possible to conceive of the current conflict between Israel and the Gazan Palestinians as a biblical "holy war"?

Headline responses

- *The commands of God to Joshua and the OT people of Israel were given in a unique period when the OT church (Israel) was a nation state.*
- * After the coming of Christ the church is multi-ethnic... consists only of those joined to Jesus... who make up God's chosen people *
- * There is no longer any physical place on the map that you can call God's holy place.*

Why such a big deal?

Genesis 17, Exodus 3, Exodus 12:48 – "... no uncircumcised person shall eat of it...", Joshua 5

2 Bible principles:

(i) God's people must have an have outward sign of belonging to him.

Colossians 2 – circumcision / baptism Matthew 28 – disciples are baptised people.

(ii) Circumcision/baptism precedes Passover/communion

Admits to church Sustains church fellowship
